Landscape Update

Mother Nature dealt us a blow last February with freezing temperatures, but then provided us with plenty of rain and cooler than usual temperatures that has helped our landscaping recover to the greatest extent possible. As an HOA, we have removed the landscaping that died during the freeze and will determine in the Spring what replacements may be necessary and appropriate. With the growth of landscaping over the last 20 years as our neighborhood has aged, some of what we lost may not require replacement. All of us have been going through the same analysis in our own yards. If you still have any dead plants at this point, it is time to remove them!

A friendly reminder that the wet and cooler conditions have led to rapid growth in many of our trees. Please make sure branches remain 7 feet above sidewalks and 12 feet above streets and alleys. Keeping trees trimmed is not only required by City Ordinance, it is a way to be kind to all the walkers in our great neighborhood! Enjoy Fall!
