



LOT MAINTENANCE

(From Governing Documents)

Section 9.3 Lot Maintenance. The Owner of each Lot shall establish grass front and sideyards, shall maintain the yards in a sanitary and attractive manner and shall edge the street curbs that run along the property line. Grass, weeds and vegetation on each Lot must be kept mowed at regular intervals so as to maintain the property in a neat and attractive manner. No vegetables shall be grown in any yard that faces a street. No Owner shall permit weeds or grass to grow to a height of greater than six inches (6") upon his property. No foundation planting, shrub or other vegetation near the house shall be allowed to grow above the bottom of any window.

Each home is required to have at least one tree planted in front in the area between the sidewalk and public street and at least one tree in back between the fence and alleyway. As of October 8, 2012, these trees must be one of the following: Cedar Elm, Shumard Oak, Live Oak, Bald Cypress or Chinese Pistache of a diameter of three (3) to five (5) inches.)... If a Homeowner's street tree dies, he/she will be required to replace the dead tree with a compliant tree of the indicated type and minimum size. Tree exemption is only allowed if the city has required you to remove a tree due to sight lines to a traffic control device, ie. signs"

An ACC request must be submitted and approved before planting any street tree.

Street and alley trees will be kept trimmed at seven (7) feet over sidewalks and twelve (12) feet above streets and alleys. The city will be starting inspections soon since this effects school busses.

ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL COMMITTEE

Nothing exterior shall be done to a home without the prior approval of the Architectural Control Committee. This includes all of the following. The standards are documented in the "Pattern Book."


ACC Approval Needed on the Following:

- Exterior Painting
- Major Landscape Changes
- Window replacement
- Home remodeling
- Fencing (New and Replacement)
- Satellite Dish
- Roof Replacement
- Solar screens
- Swimming Pools/Spas
- Playscape
- Storage Shed
- Tennis/sports court
- Arbors and Gazebos
- Driveway extension
- Garage door
- Deck/patio
- Irrigation system

HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE ARCHITECTURAL BULLETIN

The Architectural Control Committee approval process: Download the ACC approval request form from the website, complete the form with as much detail as possible including: contractor's notes, pictures, site diagrams, product websites, brochures, paint samples, etc....

Window replacement: Before a homeowner replaces any windows they must submit an ACC Approval Request Form for approval. The following is a picture of Appropriate and Inappropriate Windows and Dormers from page 17 from the he Pattern Book:


